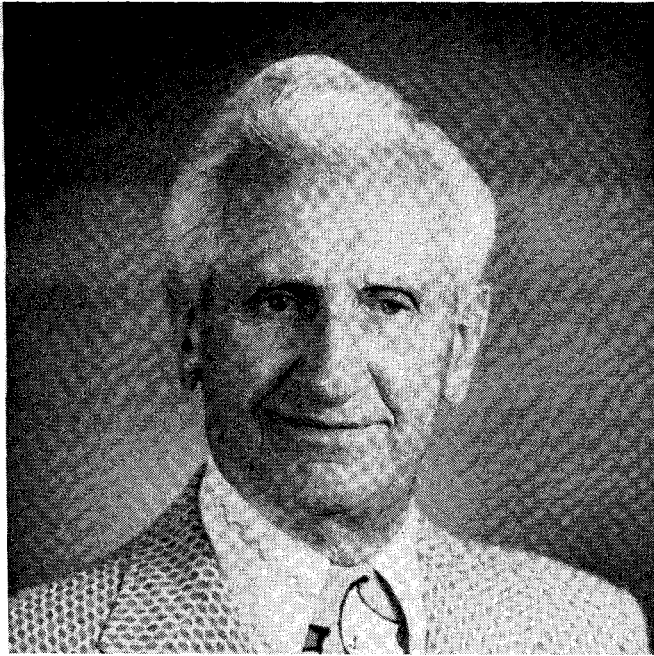


## IN MEMORIAM
