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ESTATE PLANNING CONFERENCE

University of Colorado to offer in August two-week conference on Estate Planning conducted by A. James Casner of Harvard

A two-week Estate Planning Conference will begin on August 30 at the University of Colorado.

The conference will be conducted by Professor A. James Casner of Harvard Law School, who will lecture for two hours in the morning and two hours in the afternoon, Monday through Friday, during each week of the conference.

The course will include a critical analysis of a completed estate plan, prepared on the basis of a hypothetical factual situation. This plan will present for consideration: income, estate and gift tax problems; the use of revocable and irrevocable *inter vivos* trusts; the settlement of life insurance proceeds; the importance of concurrently owned property; significant future interests problems; powers of appointment; the marital deduction; the disposal of business interest; administrative provisions used in wills and trusts; and conflict of laws problems.

Housing facilities for persons attending the conference, and their families, will be available in the dormitories on the Boulder campus.
