Dicta

One should, as soon as possible, find the particular line of law that he wishes to follow and should become an expert in that line. Fixing fees is a problem. Sometimes a lawyer will fix a fee too low, but when that happens, he should take his medicine and give his best to the case anyway. Go to older lawyers for advice if you are stuck and don't know what to do. Be skeptical about the client who claims he was sold out by his lawyer. Sometimes the lawyer is incompetent rather than that he sold out his client.
