## ANNUAL MEETING

President William L. Ransom of the American Bar Association announced today that Attorney General Homer Cummings has accepted the invitation of the association to preside at its evening session in Symphony Hall, Boston, on Wednesday evening, August 26th, during the annual meeting of the Association. The other speakers on that occasion will be Sir Maurice Amos, distinguished international lawyer and Quain Professor of Law at London University, and Mr. Justice Hanna of the High Court of Justice of the Irish Free State.

Sir Frank Gavin Duffy, lately retired as Chief Justice of Australia, has become seriously ill, and has cabled his inability to come to the United States this summer.

His place on the Wednesday evening program of the American Bar Association convention in Boston will be taken by Mr. Justice Hanna (formerly Sergeant Hanna) of the High Court of Justice of the Irish Free State. Mr. Justice Hanna has many friends and admirers in the United States, where he is widely known as a scholar and jurist.

Other distinguished jurists who will come to America will address the convention on subjects of timely significance in the development of Anglo-Saxon law and the institutions of government. The guests of the association will include Lord Thankerton, Lord of Appeal in Ordinary; Lord Wright of Durley, Master of the Rolls and a Lord of Appeal; Sir Maurice Amos, distinguished international lawyer and Quain Professor of Comparative Law at the University of London; Mr. Justice Henry Hague Davis, of the Supreme Court of Canada; Mr. Leonard Brockington, K.C., of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada; and Sir Frank Gavin Duffy, Chief Justice of Australia.

The presence of these eminent jurists from abroad will give an unusual interest and distinction to this year's meeting of the American Bar Association. At the annual dinner on August 27, the speakers will be Lord Wright of Durley, Mr. Brockington of Canada, and Mr. John W. Davis of the American Bar.
